FUNDRAISING SUPPORT

The Charity is here to support you with your fundraising event. Our Supporter Care Team can offer advice and assistance. The contact details for the team are at the bottom of each page of this guide.

Our Regional Fundraising Team can also provide guidance on your fundraising event. If you want to know who your local regional fundraiser is, you can find the information on the Charity's intranet, website or via the Supporter Care Team.

SPONSORSHIP

Sponsorship is a great way of raising funds – tell friends, family, neighbours, colleagues, - anyone who'll listen, about what you are doing, and why you've chosen to raise money for The Fire Fighters Charity. Simply ask them if they'd like to sponsor you. Then let them know they can either do this by completing the enclosed Sponsorship Form or, if you've set up an online sponsorship page such as Virgin Money Giving or JustGiving, you can give them your unique page link and they can donate easily online.

Online giving websites

The Fire Fighters Charity is officially registered with both Virgin Money Giving and JustGiving. Both websites provide simple and effective ways of donating money directly to your chosen charity. JustGiving provides you with the option of text giving on social media but don't submit cash to JustGiving, send it to the Supporter Care Team using a paying in slip.

You can set up a free, customised fundraising page at either site, which your friends, family and colleagues can then visit to sponsor you securely online, using their debit or credit card. Using your unique page link, you can also add this to your emails and promotion, to encourage more people to visit your online giving site.

Hot Tip! If you are raising money for more than one charity, use Virgin Money Giving.

To begin setting up your own online fundraising page, just visit **www.virginmoneygiving.com** or **www.justgiving.com**, and follow the instructions - it really is that simple! If you are taking part in a big event, such as a marathon, then please select that event from the Charity's event list.

Hot Tip! Make sure you name your page clearly so we can identify you and allocate any money to your fundraising total. Your friends might know your nickname is 'Super Kate', but we won't!

Make the most of your online fundraising page

- **Make it your own:** Tell people what you are doing, why you are doing it, and why you want to support The Fire Fighters Charity.
- **Update it:** To keep your page fresh, update it on a regular basis with details of what you are doing and your progress.
- **Advertise it:** Ensure you promote your event well using local and social media. Send friends, family and colleagues an email telling them what you are doing and include the link to your fundraising site (you can copy and paste the address link to your fundraising page into the email). If you are on Facebook, advertise your page via your status update and remember to include the link to your fundraising page as well. Ask your Regional Fundraiser for support, or if you work for a Fire and Rescue Service consider talking to your communications team.



SET YOUR FUNDRAISING ALIGHT!

You've already asked your close friends and family for donations, but you are still short of your fundraising target.

How can you reach more people? Social media is a powerful way to get your story and your fundraising page to a potentially unlimited audience. Here are some top tips on using social media and online tools to reach your fundraising goals. Firstly, have you set up a Just Giving or a Virgin Money Giving fundraising page? These are the easiest ways to advertise your fundraising activities and get people to sponsor you!

Visit www.justgiving.com or www.virginmoneygiving.com and search for The Fire Fighters Charity to start fundraising for us – set up your page and get your friends and family to donate – we will do the rest!

Once you have your fundraising page, how about using some of these ways to promote it?

Twitter

- Use Twitter to share your fundraising page – write what you're doing and why people should sponsor you, in the shortest sentence possible.
- Ask your followers to 'retweet' your link – so it reaches their followers too (remember: the shorter your tweet, the more retweet-able it is).
- Ask us to share your link on our Facebook or Twitter sites. Search for us at @firefighters999

JustGiving

- Use the JustGiving widget to show your latest fundraising total on your own website – <http://widgets.justgiving.com/>
- Use the JustGiving iPhone App to share your fundraising page to WhatsApp, a cross-platform mobile messaging App which allows you to exchange messages without having to pay for SMS. People using JustGiving on the mobile web can also share their donations on WhatsApp

YouTube

- Get on YouTube. Make a video – maybe a funny parody of your training, or just you telling the camera what you're doing and why people should donate.

On Flickr or Instagram

- Take photos of your training or event and share these on sites like Flickr or Instagram.
- Show people what you're doing and why they should support you. Don't forget to link to your page.

Create a presentation

- Create a presentation and upload it to sites like Prezi or SlideShare. Don't be boring! You can make it fun.

On Facebook

- Update your Facebook status with your JustGiving or Virgin Money Giving link – so all of your friends see your link in their News Feeds. For an extra push, post your link on their walls.
- Ask friends to 'share' your status update for you. Via their statuses, you can reach people you might not know.
- Use the JustGiving Facebook application to invite people on Facebook to sponsor you.
- Ask your friends to use Facebook Connect on JustGiving after they've donated. This way they can share your page with their Facebook friends. You can also use it to promote your page. Post your status on the Charity's wall – look for us at www.facebook.com/thefirefighterscharity

On a blog

- If you've got a great story, start a blog about it. Blogs are a great way to share your photos, videos and tweets in one place, keeping your supporters up-to-date.

On the internet

- Search ALL of these sites for people talking about The Fire Fighters Charity. If you find people interested in the same cause, talk to them. They might be interested in supporting you, and you might make some new friends along the way..or simply email a link to your page to everyone you know with a little description of what you are doing to raise funds and why, and who knows, you might find some generous people out there!



MAXIMISING INCOME

There are many ways you can ensure that you maximize the income raised from your event.

Gift Aid

We suggest trying to gift aid donations over £5. As long as the donor is a UK tax payer, gift aid helps us get an extra 25p for every £1 donated, at no cost to the donor. That means if someone sponsors you £10 we can claim an extra £2.50 in Gift Aid from the Government, making that total donation worth £12.50!

Hot Tip! To ensure the Charity can claim Gift Aid from your sponsorship, please make certain your sponsors include the required details and tick the Gift Aid box on your sponsorship form and on your online fundraising page. To qualify for Gift Aid, the amount the donor pays in income tax or capital gains must be at least equal to the amount we will claim on your donation in the tax year.

While anybody can sponsor you, the Charity may not be able to claim Gift Aid from all your sponsors. Further details relating to Gift Aid rules can be found on our website www.firefighterscharity.org.uk/giftaid. If you have any queries about this, please contact your Regional Fundraiser.

Corporate Support

A good way to drum up support is to contact local companies in your area to see if they are willing to support you. Organisations usually prefer to support charities through local initiatives and within their communities. A written letter explaining what you are doing and the personal reasons as to why you have chosen to support the Charity, may just pull the right strings and encourage them to make a donation to your fundraising efforts! Alternatively, if you are holding a raffle, auction or lucky dip, local companies may be able to donate an item.

Hot Tip! Try contacting companies that have needed the help of the fire service in the past, or that have an affiliation to the fire service – all you need to do is ask!

Your Regional Fundraiser will be able to help you with a sample letter to use, which you can then adapt for your own use.

Your Regional Fundraiser can also assist you in getting local press to run your story.

Match Funding

Many organisations offer match funding schemes, where their staff are involved in fundraising. Each company's policy is different, but in general for those that take part, it means that for every £1 you raise for the Charity, your company will match it. This could double your fundraising total, so it really is worth checking with your employer to see if it is something they offer.



FUNDRAISING IDEAS

A great and fun way to help you reach your fundraising total is to hold an event, or a few small events. These could be anything from quiz nights to supermarket bag-packing, a bake sale to a car wash, a 'come dine with me' dinner party to a coffee morning!

£1 – £50

● Supermarket bag-packing

Ask your local supermarket if you and your volunteers can help pack bags at the checkouts. Put a collection box near you so shoppers can make donations once you've packed their bags.

● Guess how many sweets in the jar

Buy a few bags of sweets. Count them out, write the number down and keep it safe! Then fill a see-through jar with the sweets and get your friends, family or colleagues to donate £1 to guess how many sweets are inside. Once everyone has placed their guesses, reveal who is the closest and they win the sweet-filled jar!

£50 – £100

● The square game

Divide a board into 100 squares, and choose a theme to fill the board – it could be football teams, colours, names, bands or just numbers. Ask players to donate £1 to pick a square with the chance of winning £25. After you've sold all the squares, ask someone independent to randomly pick a square out of a hat to be the winner. If you sell all the squares you will have £100, minus the prize money, gives you £75 towards your fundraising total!

● Car boot sale

Have a clear out and get down to your local car boot sale – you'll be surprised at how much money you can make!

£100 – £300

● Car wash

You can hold a car wash on any private location providing you have the land owners permission – if you work at a fire station you could use the station, but if that's not possible then you could ask your local supermarket or football club if you can use their car park – anywhere lots of cars will pass! Once you've secured your location, start using posters, local adverts, local press (radio, newspapers), social media and banners to promote your event. Always remember to include the date, time and location! On the day, make sure you've got buckets, sponges and gift aid forms, along with plenty of volunteers to help wash cars!

● Servant auction

See if your school, local pub or community hall will let you hold a charity fundraising night and servant auction. Ask some of your bravest friends and family members to give up a few hours of their lives to be 'servants' (within reason!) for any winning bidders.

See the next page for a simple step-by-step guide to running a collection for the Charity. These steps can also be followed if you are holding any of the fundraising event ideas above.



RUNNING A CHARITY COLLECTION

To make your charity collection day as successful as possible, here are some useful tips on how to organise and run your event to make sure your collection follows charity law.

- **Pick your location** – Location is key to a successful collection – it may sound obvious, but the best places to collect are busy and public areas such as supermarkets, shopping centres, stadiums, fairs etc. In most cases you will need to request permission from the manager of a venue or from the local council if you are carrying out a street collection.
- **Recruit your volunteers** – The more helpers you have, the more attention you will attract from the general public! Having volunteers who can collect in uniform is also really eye-catching and helps maximise donations.
- **Prepare buckets for your collection** – Make sure you have enough buckets for your event. They need to be sealed until the cash is counted - buckets and seals can be sourced by contacting your brigade bucket responsible person.
- **Organise your support materials** – Don't forget to order any other Charity literature such as posters, leaflets and stickers you might need for your event by contacting your Regional Fundraiser.
- **Don't forget your insurance!** – The Fire Fighters Charity's Public Liability Insurance provides cover of up to £5 million. This covers Public and Legal Liability on the Charity's behalf (it does not extend to other charities or causes who may benefit from any monies raised). It is important to note that any external activities or equipment used at events (e.g. vehicles, bouncy castles, marquees, funfair rides etc.) must hold their own Public Liability cover. You should be able to provide evidence of this cover as well as proof/verification that maintenance and inspection programmes and safe systems of work are in place for the equipment. It won't take much effort to apply, just complete the Fundraising Event Notification Form (FEN) and send it at least three weeks prior to your event to fundraising@firefighterscharity.org.uk along with evidence of cover for any external activities/equipment. Once your application has been processed, you will be sent an email confirming your cover. In the event of a claim, please contact a member of Supporter Care immediately for advice on the correct procedure. If you have any queries please email fundraising@firefighterscharity.org.uk or telephone 01256 366581.
- **Nominate two people to be in charge of all monies raised** – This will ensure that the funds raised are safely collected and accounted for, and don't go missing throughout the day.
- **Give a sticker to every donor** – Please ensure you hand the sticker to the donor, so that they attach it to their own clothes, thus minimising any liability for damage to certain types of clothing, or suggestion of inappropriate action. You may also want to give people a leaflet about the Charity if they ask what we do.
- **Remember to fill in a Gift Aid form for every donation over £5.00** – As long as the donor is a UK tax payer, for every £1 gifted the Charity can reclaim an additional 25p from HM Customs & Revenue for donations. A blank Gift Aid form is included in this pack and can be photocopied as required.
- **Count and bank all collected monies as soon as possible** – At the end of your collection take the buckets to a safe place and count up all donations with at least two people present. Please use the paying in slip attached to the covering letter to pay in all funds raised on your collection day. This will then be credited against your fundraising total. Money can be paid into any local Barclays bank. If you have any queries contact the Supporter Care team on 01256 366581.
- **Fill in the enclosed Monies Return Form** with the results from your collection, and return it with any completed Gift Aid Forms.

STAYING SAFE & INSURING YOUR FUNDRAISING EVENT

Charity Information

Under Charity Law all materials that are part of a fundraising event must clearly state that the money is being donated to The Fire Fighters Charity. Therefore, the information “The Fire Fighters Charity, Charity registered in England and Wales (1093387) and Scotland (SC040096)”, must appear on all posters, leaflets, stickers, advertisements, collection buckets, etc.

All funds raised for an event must be donated to the Charity on behalf of that event and can't be held as a donation against future fundraising events.

Cash Handling

There are a number of 'golden rules' when dealing with Charity money:

- Under Charity law all donations in money or goods become the property of the Charity from the moment of giving – all funds raised for a Charity must go to that Charity.
- Money should be counted and signed for in a secure environment by at least two people aged over 16 – we have a double signature form you can use for this purpose.
- Money should be banked in the Charity's bank account within three days of the event.
- No money should be left unattended, taken home by individuals or held in a non-Charity bank or building society account.
- If you are using collection buckets these should have sealed lids. The seals should only be broken when counting the money with two people present.
- Only those aged 16 or over should collect money in public.
- Nobody should be unreasonably pressured into donating to the Charity.



Banking

Remember the safest place for your money is in the Charity's bank account. You can pay in your money using your Barclays station paying in book at any branch of Barclay's Bank. Alternatively you can request a paying in slip for your fundraising event from our Supporter Care Team, send a cheque to Charity Head Office or pay in online via our website. More information about how to pay in your money is available on the **Monies Return Form**.

If you have any concerns that money has been mislaid or stolen please contact the Charity on 01256 366566.

Licences and Permissions

Some events may require additional licences or permissions. Please ensure that you follow all terms and conditions of the licence. Examples include:

- Collection Permit – these are needed for all collections held on a public highway including pedestrianised areas and are available from local councils on a first come first served basis.
- Permission to collect on private premises (e.g permission from the store manager for a collection in a supermarket).
- Entertainment Licences.
- Public Road Closure Orders.
- Street Trading Licence – for goods sold from a fixed stand on a public highway or shopping centre.

If you are not sure if your event needs a special licence or permission please ask our Supporter Care Team or your local Regional Fundraiser.

Event Insurance

The Charity's Public Liability insurance provides cover up to £5 million for the Charity's public and legal liability. The insurance covers the Charity's liability only and does not extend to other charities or causes who may benefit from the monies raised, or to any providers of external equipment or activities.

Fundraising Event Notification Form

We now have a single form – the **Fundraising Event Notification Form (FEN)** – which needs to be completed fully for all events requiring Public Liability Insurance cover from The Fire Fighters Charity.

To obtain event insurance for your fundraising event, please contact our Supporter Care Team for the FEN or your Regional Fundraiser.

External Activities and Equipment

If you are using any external activities and/or equipment (e.g. bouncy castles, marquees, funfair rides, external catering) they must have their own public liability cover. You will be required to provide evidence of this cover with your completed FEN as well as proof that maintenance and inspection programmes and safe systems of work are in place.

How to apply

Once you have completed the Fundraising Event Notification Form please send it to our Supporter Care Team at least three weeks before your fundraising event along with evidence of cover for any external activities and equipment. Depending on your fundraising event, our insurance company may have some further questions or request additional information. Once your application has been processed we will send you an email confirming your cover along with a **Monies Return Form**, which is also included in this guide, and an **Accident/Near Miss Reporting Form**.

What to do if there is a claim/near miss?

In the event of a claim, or a near miss that could lead to a claim, please complete your **Accident/Near Miss Reporting Form** with as much information as possible and return it within seven days of the event to our Supporter Care Team.

Health and Safety

Running a safe event is really important. In completing the **Fundraising Event Notification Form** for Public Liability Insurance you will be asked to consider health and safety elements of your event and complete a risk assessment. Key considerations include: is the venue suitable, do you have enough support to run the event and is the equipment being used safe?

PAYING IN YOUR FUNDRAISING

Charity Law

All donations in money and goods become the property of the Charity from the moment of giving. The Charity Commission insist that all money must be paid to the relevant charity within **3 days** of any fundraising event without any deductions for expenses. Expenses should be claimed separately.

Monies Return Form

You will find within this guide a Monies Return Form, incorporating instructions on how to pay in your fundraising, allowing us to efficiently allocate the funds and save the Charity administration fees. Please ensure you always clearly complete and return the form to the Supporter Care Team, keeping a copy for your own records. Upon receipt of your Monies Return Form and fundraising, we will issue a thank you.

Online Fundraising Pages

If you have raised money using online fundraising sites such as Virgin Money Giving or JustGiving, you don't need to do anything as the money will come directly to us. Don't worry – provided you have followed the simple rules for setting up your page, we'll know it was you that raised the money and will allocate it to your fundraising total.

General Fundraising Rules


- Collectors should not block, intimidate any potential donors, shake cans, or gather in large numbers.
- A record should be kept of all monies raised and helpers present during any collection – this may be asked for by Councils.
- If part of your fundraising is going towards covering your participation fees, you should include a statement that explains this. However, once you have covered your fees that statement is no longer required.
- Special rules apply to public raffles or prize draws (small or large), so please seek advice from the Supporter Care Team or your Regional Fundraiser.
- It's good practice to keep a track of your fundraising achievements including dates, amount raised and banked.



PROMOTING YOUR EVENT

There are many ways you can promote your event – you can use posters, email, local newspapers, radio stations and social media. If you want the Charity to give your event a shout out on our social pages please contact your Regional Fundraiser.

The Charity has an 'in aid of' logo which should be used on promotional materials for fundraising events. This is available on the Charity's intranet, by contacting our Supporter Care Team or your Regional Fundraiser.
